







Variety of Action Evolves New Depth to Drama

In order to adequately indicate the nature of what we were attempting in each production this year, we initiated two different categories, or series of productions. First, the category of Major Theatre was initiated to indicate a production in which we would direct our energies in all phases of production. That is, scenery, lighting, costumes, acting, directing, promotion and house management all were planned and carried out in as much detail as time, budget, and personnel would permit. Second, the category of Workshop Theatre was initiated to indicate a production in which we would direct our energies in only a selected few phases of production, with only a necessary minimum of attention on the other phases. Primarily, this meant emphasis on interpretation, acting and directing, with a minimum of emphasis on the visual effects of a production.



CHEERLEADERS, led by Captain Linda Shinn, support the Riders in every sport.






Football

The Muleriders tied with Harding for the runner-up spot in league play in 1966 behind tri-champions A&M, Ouachita, and State Teachers. In one of the most topsy-turvy races in AIC history, all but one team remained in contention for the conference title until their last game.

An explosive offense, the league's best with an average of 350 yards total offense per game, sparked the Riders to a 5-3 season and provided the fans with some of the most exciting football in the school's history. A lack of consistency, however, cost the Riders their first title in 15 years.

Under the watchful eyes of head coach Auburn Smith, the 1966 Mules placed three players—tailback Jim Leonard, end Travis Giles, and linebacker Johnny Tune—on the All-AIC team. Two others—Steve Elliott and Bob Hattabaugh—received honorable mention.







Basketball








Intramurals




SSC Reaches Maturity With Dynamic Leader

that such an unusual and haunting photograph does have a place in this book purely on its merits we are including this copyrighted photo by Don Hale, Jr.





